- Loperamide hydrochloride (Diamide Relief) cap 2 mg – up to 30 cap available on a PSO (p'code 2365545)
- Imiglucerase (Cerezyme) inj 40 iu per ml, 400 iu vial – Special Authority – Retail pharmacy – Section 29 (p'code 2373165)
- Sodium chloride (Pfizer) inj 0.9%, 5 ml (p'code 691941) and 10 ml (p'code 691968) – Up to 5 inj available on a PSO
- Deferiprone (Ferriprox) tab 500 mg (p'code 2369532) and oral liq 100 mg per 1 ml, 250 ml OP (p'code 2369524) – Special Authority – Retail pharmacy
- Cilazapril (Zapril) tab 0.5 mg (p'code 2354330), 2.5 mg (p'code 2354349) and 5 mg (p'code 2354357)

- Ondansetron (Dr Reddy's Ondansetron) tab 4 mg (p'code 2369508) and 8 mg (p'code 2369516) – Maximum of 12 tab per prescription and maximum of 6 tab per dispensing – not more than one prescription per month – restrictions can be waived by Special Authority
- Erlotinib hydrochloride (Tarceva) tab 100 mg (p'code 2245159) and 150 mg (p'code 2245167) – Retail pharmacy-Specialist – Special Authority
- Anastrozole (Aremed) tab 1 mg (p'code 2360799)
- Mycophenolate mofetil (Myaccord) tab 500 mg (p'code 2326914) and cap 250 mg (p'code 2346281) – Special Authority – Retail pharmacy
- Budesonide (Budenocort) powder for inhalation 200 µg per dose, 200 dose OP (p'code 2360276) and 400 µg per dose, 200 dose OP (p'code 2360284)
- Chloramphenicol (Chlorafast) eye drops 0.5% (p'code 2368137)

- Sodium chloride (Pharmacia and Multichem) inj 0.9%, 20 ml – addition of Up to 5 inj available on a PSO
- Ezetimibe (Ezetrol) tab 10 mg – amended Special Authority criteria
- Ezetimibe with simvastatin (Vytorin) tab 10 mg with simvastatin 10 mg, 20 mg, 40 mg and 80 mg – amended Special Authority criteria
- Tenofovir disoproxil fumarate (Viread) tab 300 mg – amended Special Authority criteria
- Mianserin hydrochloride (Tolvon) tab 30 mg – amended Special Authority criteria
- Capecitabine (Xeloda) tab 150 mg and 500 mg – amended Special Authority criteria
- Mycophenolate mofetil (Cellcept and Myaccord) tab 500 mg and cap 250 mg – amended Special Authority criteria
- Rituximab inj 100 mg per 10 ml vial and inj 500 mg per 50 ml vial (Mabthera), and inj 1 mg for ECP (Baxter) – amended Special Authority criteria
- Travoprost (Travatan) eye drops 0.004%, 2.5 ml OP – removal of additional subsidy by endorsement
